





Derwentwater and Latrigg, Cumbria

The wooded shoreline and nearby fells are perfectly reflected in the glassy surface of Derwentwater. This alluring lake is dotted with islands, with footpaths around the shore and up to the dramatic fells and crags. Latrigg is a small, easily accessible fell north of Keswick, leading into the Skiddaw range.

Hadrian's Wall, Northumberland

This striking defensive wall was built by the Romans under Emperor Hadrian in AD 122 against a northern invasion, a chain of forts, towers and mile castles, guarded by thousands of soldiers. Viewed above a snowy landscape, Hadrian's Wall follows the undulating natural landscape for 117km (80 Roman miles).

Cavendish, Suffolk

Mynydd Carningli, Newport, Pembrokeshire

One of the most striking hills in Pembrokeshire, rocky Carningli looms over the town of Newport, with magnificent coastal and inland views. It was once a volcano that erupted around 450 million years ago. Its name means Mountain of Angels and is associated with St Brynach, a 6th century missionary.

Roman Baths, Bath, Somerset

Founded by the Romans as a temple and bathing complex, Aquae Sulis derives from the UK's only hot springs. Fed by water at a temperature of 46.5°C, the original Roman baths were covered but are now open to the air. Pillars and statues were added in the 19th century. The Great Bath still uses Roman plumbing.

Godrevy, near Portreath, Cornwall

Facing the Atlantic, east of St Ives Bay, the exposed beach at Godrevy is popular with surfers. Godrevy Lighthouse is set on an offshore island. It was made famous by Virginia Woolfe's book To The Lighthouse. The headlands are rich in wild flowers, and basking sharks are often seen in summer off the coast.

Botany Bay, near Broadstairs, Kent

At the foot of towering white cliffs, where sea erosion has created caves and chalk stacks, is a beautiful sandy beach. Ingleborough, Yorkshire

One of Yorkshire's Three Peaks, 723m high, with a distinctive flat top, Ingleborough's slopes form a natural limestone terrace. It dominates a landscape of gritstone-capped peaks, underground cave systems and exposed limestone pavements, created from huge expanses of rock pressurised by glaciers.
